E2SHB 1185	Reducing environmental impacts associated with lighting products.
ESHB 1589	Supporting Washington's clean energy economy and transitioning to a clean, affordable, and reliable energy future.
ESHB 1893	Concerning unemployment insurance benefits for striking or lockout workers.
HB 1917	Adopting the physician assistant compact.
HB 1927	Reducing the number of days that a worker's temporary total disability must continue to receive industrial insurance compensation for the day of an injury and the three-day period following the injury.
HB 2114	Improving housing stability for tenants subject to the residential landlord-tenant act and the manufactured/mobile home landlord-tenant act by limiting rent and fee increases, requiring notice of rent and fee increases, limiting fees and deposits, establishing a landlord resource center and associated services, authorizing tenant lease termination, creating parity between lease types, and providing for attorney general enforcement.
SHB 2127	Concerning workers' compensation incentives to return to work.
E2SHB 2160	Promoting community and transit-oriented housing development.
SHB 2226	Concerning collecting data on the H-2A worker program and from certain hand harvesters.
ESHB 2361	Phasing in the requirement that only standardized health plans may be offered on the health benefit exchange.
HB 2454	Extending an existing hazardous substance tax exemption for certain agricultural crop protection products that are temporarily warehoused but not otherwise used, manufactured, packaged, or sold in the state of Washington.
ESHB 2482	Reinstating semiconductor tax incentives.
